## 🌻 All About Me & The World Around Us

Children settle into the school routine, build early vocabulary, and explore the changing seasons. Focus: identity, greetings, colours, autumn, body, and Christmas.

# **TERM 2 (January–March)**

# 🏶 Everyday Life & Springtime

Children begin using English in practical contexts, building vocabulary related to home, food, and play. As spring arrives, we explore nature and daily routines, helping children express likes, needs, and actions.

January	Food & Snacks – fruits, vegetables, simple meals, hot drinks. Clothes (Part 1) – hat, scarf, gloves, coat, boots, sweater.	"Put On Your Coat", snack	Flashcards (food, clothes), pretend shop game, memory cards.
February	Clothes (Part 2) & Body (neck to waist) – shoulders, chest, arms, stomach, waist.	"If You're Wearing Red Today", dress- up games, body movement songs.	Clothes cut- outs, matching games, action flashcards.
March	It's Spring! – plants, flowers, spring animals, weather.	"Spring Is Here", nature walks, flower crafts.	Flashcards (flowers, baby animals), spring sorting games.

In the final term, children develop emotional awareness, basic number skills, and language for summer experiences. It's a time for expression, celebration, and reflection.
